
















SYNOPSIS

It all begins in Zululand in 1871.

The Zulus celebrate their departure for the mines of Johannesburg South Africa, leaving their wife and children in the hope of a better living.

In the suffocating heat of the mine, half naked and dressed in skins, the minors create the first codes of rhythmic languages using their tools.

As time goes by, the minors leave their skins for pants and rubber boots and the first rails are installed.

Forced to work in an unsanitary and inhuman conditions, many of them die. Discovering a body lying in a cocopan, one of the minor starts to shout. He is immediately warned by one of his own reminding him that it is strictly forbidden to speak. This is how they start hitting their boots in order to be able to communicate which each other.

Other deported minors from Malawi, Mozambique, Zimbabwe meet with South African minors and exchange the different rhythmic codes of their languages giving birth to the dance of gumboots.

Over time, during their break, the minors meet to share a beer singing and dancing all together.

PHILIPPE BARREAU CO-CREATOR, PRODUCER

After business school, Philippe started in the business more than twenty-three years ago by negotiating partnerships (sponsors and media) for theaters and for different entertainment production companies.

In 1996, he joined a producer and headed the communication and production departments.

In 2004, he decided to create his own entertainment company CITYPROD. Its influence is international and produces shows all over the world.

The shows produced so far are: Umoja, The Stars of Bolchoï, Acrobatic Nutcracker by the National Circus of China, Shadowland, Fire of Anatolia, Tribute to Miriam Makeba, The National Ballet of Cuba, Red Army Choirs, The Imperial Ballet of Russia, Georgian Legend, Natural Mystic Tour, Jimmy Cliff, Kool and The Gang, Soweto Gospel Choir, Magic Flute South African version, Tristan & Isolde The Symphonic Celtic Ballet, Cirkafrika, Sarafina

In 2017 Philippe realized his dream by resuscitating the magic of *Les Miserables* in a French version concert with a triumphant French tour that exports around the world.

In 2019 he has been the Executive Producer of the French Musical *Siddhartha l'Opera Rock*, which was a great success during 6 weeks at Le Palais des Sports de Paris.

Last year, Philippe co-created and produced *Soweto Gumboots* where the world premieres have been taken place at Soweto Theatre in Johannesburg last February and in November at the Lyric Theatre Gold Reef City in Johannesburg.

MAGDA HADNAGY CO-CREATOR, DIRECTOR, SCENOGRAPHER COSTUMES DESIGNER

Magda began to learn the performing arts - singing, dancing, acrobatics - at a very young age.

When she was twelve, she sang in Opera de Paris choirs.

At seventeen, she brought her first album on the Polydor label in France.

Magda produced shows throughout the world, directing and choreographing them as well as designing the costumes and sets. At the same time, she also staged many shows for French and International productions.

In 2017 she took the artistic direction of CITYPROD and staged in particular the French version concert of the world phenomenon show *Les Miserables*.

In 2019 Magda ensured the staging, choreographies and scenography of the French Musical *Siddhartha l'Opera Rock*.

Beginning 2020, she staged and choreographed the new show *Othello The Musical* and in February she has been director, scenographer and costumes designer of the new South African show *Soweto Gumboots* that she also cocreated.

MDUDUZI MAGAGULA CHOREOGRAPHER

Born in Soweto, Mduduzi began to learn tap dancing at the age of 12 under the direction of the South African Zwelibanzi "Mkhulu" Bhwangwe, the legendary old man. The latter does not only teach him to dance. It also teaches him about survival, discipleship, respect and prosperity.

In 2004 and 2005, he participated in two successful shows called *Tapsula* and *Amataps* at the Market Theater in Johannesburg.

In 2007, he joined the South African musical show *Mother Africa* as a choreographer and tap dancer. He stayed there for ten years and traveled several times in Europe, but also in America and Oceania.

For the 2017 and 2018 seasons he joined the new distribution of the South African Musical *Sarafina* as first dancer and participated in successful performances at the Joburg Theater in Johannesburg but also at the Fort de France Festival in Martinique.



VINCENT NCABASHE AUTOR, COMPOSITOR*

Vincent Nickname "Viva" was born and raised in Diepkloof in Soweto. While still in school he joined the *Thabisong Youth Club* which was formed in 1974 by Mrs Makhudu.

The aim of the Youth club was to keep the children out of the streets, crime and drugs which for so many years was a great success as it produced the best. He received training in Drama, poetry and Dance.

In the Early 80's he was one of the member which formed a group called *Rashile Poets* which performed a lot in shopping malls, markets and community hall which gave him training and experience and growth to his craft. With that he toured Nationally and to neighboring countries to mention a few Swaziland and Cape town that is where he realized that his dreams and aspirations where finally coming true.

In 1990 he formed a group called *Rishile Gumboot Dancers of Soweto* which was one of the most amazing long successful Gumboot shows that toured South Africa and internationally. Vincent was a lead singer, Dancer and guitarist which carried the show beautifully with his talent. Gumboot show which performed in Market Theatre and in the whole world.

In 2019 he meets Philippe Barreau and Magda Hadnagy and decide to create together with Mduduzi Magagula a new version of the Gumboot show called *Soweto Gumboots* for which Vincent will be the author and compositor.

At the same time Vincent continues to devote the remaining time to training the young people of Soweto in dance (Gumboot) and music.

MANDLA NHLAPO MUSICAL DIRECTOR VOCAL DIRECTOR

Born in Soweto, Mandla begins to take an interest in the arts at the age of 12. He be trained as an actor, dancer, djembe and marimba player.

In 2000 he joins the *dikwa band* as a percussionist vocalist and collaborates with Ntiski and Thandiswa Mazwai, Sizwe Vena, Hugh Masekela and Sibongile Khumalo.

In 2007 he joins *Vuyani Dance Theatre* as a percussionist vocalist, and does tour the globe to places like USA, France, Congo, Mali, Angola, Switzerland to just count a few.

In 2013 he becomes Musical Director for *Sinokhanyo Dance Theatre* and in 2014 he represents South Africa in Cairo Egypt at the International drum Festival.

From 2017, he teaches music for three years in Johannesburg and at the same time made marimbas.

In 2019, he joins *Soweto Gumboots* as a percussionist, vocalist and also as Musical Director and Vocal Director.



OLIVER HAUSER LIGHTING DESIGNER

Oliver's passion for lighting, his creativity, integrity, and energetic work ethic has become well known in the South African live events industry.

After achieving a diploma in Entertainment Technology in 2009, Hauser has worked on over 250 productions across a wide range of genres: Television, drama, comedy, opera, musicals, avant-garde dance, contemporary music, conceptual performance and corporate events.

He has designed, co-ordinated and managed lighting for productions at prestigious venues in Barcelona, Paris, Zurich, Berlin, Beijing, Lagos, the United States and in other cities internationally.




SOWETO GUMBOOTS, un des temps forts du Festival

S i vous cherchez sur le net, vous trouverez quelques bribes du grand spectacle Soweto Gumboots qui tapent, claquent, en symbiose, d'un seul bloc, comme un assaut guerrier bien orchestné sous la direction musicale de Vincent NCabashe, et les chorégraphies millimétrées de Mduduzi Magagula. Le récit place d'emblée le spectateur dans une posture d'actualité : celle de la résistance face à toute forme d'oppression.

C'est la danse des « boucliersréunis », qui de manière symbolique livre l'entame. En tenue de guerriers zoulous, les hommes forment un mur de protection. Les voix sublimes d'Afrique du Sud tellement appréciées se mettent à scander des chants de luttes ; trépidants sur la scène, ils sont prêts à résister contre toutes les attaques qui ont démoli et continuent d'abimer les habitants de Zoulouland. Car il s'agit de gagner la guerre, qu'elle prenne la forme de l'actuelle pandémie ou encore celle de l'apartheid qui subsiste encore de nos jours, faisant des noirs des hommes de seconde catégorie.

Puis ils quittent la peau du guer-



rier pour, torses nus et dégoulinants de sueur, revêtir le bleu du labeur. Devenus « travailleur du fond de la mine », ils arpentent le plateau pour creuser jusqu'à l'épuisement : ils savent, dans le brouillard de leurs esprits abattus, qu'ils vont devoir besogner sans avoir le droit de parler, ni broncher.

Une musique percussive, langage codé des bottes

Ils savent que ces longues cavités souterraines, vieilles de plus d'un siècle, situées à plus de 4 km sous terre peuvent à toutinstant les engloutir au profit du capitalisme... Cependant, souffrance et mutisme imposés ne sauraient en aucun cas être la règle ! Les mineursdanseurs se réinventent : frappant avec une énergie exubérante et passionnée leur cowskin, ils exécutent de manière tellement synchrone une musique percussive qu'ils créent au fil des temps un langage codé obtenu en martelant du plat de leurs mains leurs grandes bottes de caoutchouc. Comme les battements de cœur

THEATRE Gumboots gave silenced miners a voice

MPILETSO MOTUMI

BACK in 1871 when miners were not allowed to speak while they worked they came up with their own language.

It was the language of the gumboots and it is being brought back to life with *Rhythms – The Gumboots Show* premièring at the Soweto Theatre tomorrow.

Together with choreographer Mduduzi Magagula and musical director Vincent Ncabashe, director Magda Hadnagy will bring this important chapter in South African history back to life after 15 years.

The show tells the story of miners, their hardships to provide for their families, as they leave Zululand to work on the mines. The show is a physical performance as well as a historical tale.

"I wanted to do this creation because I am very involved and committed to South Africa. Most of the time, overseas, when they have SA productions, they show the audience only happiness... gumboots is a big part of the history.


"In 1871, the first miners were Zulu. This show represents the years from 1871 to 1947. It will teach the audience how the gumboots started," said Hadnagy.

"They were not allowed to speak in the mines. How can you prohibit someone from speaking? There is a lot of things about slavery, I fight against that, but I also want to show the world why and how those men were treated and how they died in the mine."

Hadnagy said the production would show how gumboot dancing developed.

"The beginning relays the history and then later on in the show we get to the early 1930s and go into gumboot songs. It is really about the South African miners' history."

She said the one thing she wanted to achieve was to get rid of the ignorance which people may have of the history of the country. For the last two years they were developing the script before finally auditioning for the show
